



Despite its impressive and growing amounts of agricultural production, Pakistan still continues to struggle with significant levels of food insecurity. Hunger and malnutrition continue to prevail mainly due to poor distribution of resources and low purchasing power amongst poor people.

Islamic Relief is helping fight hunger by working with research entities, provincial bodies and the national government to support farmers with seeds that require little water. We also help them to better market their products locally.

Additionally, our work within food security includes:

- Distributing seeds and toolkits to help with crop production
- Introducing kitchen gardening to promote pesticidefree produce and availability of high nutritional food
- Establishing dairy and agriculture value chains to help farmers move goods from farm to the consumer
- Restocking herds to benefit individuals for whom animals play a major role in better nutrition
- Establishing agriculture markets to bridge the gap between buyer and seller
- Introducing irrigation systems suitable for drought prone areas
- Improving storage of fresh produce through food processing to increase its shelf life
