1. Introduction

Islamic Relief is a UK based International Non-Governmental Organization (INGO) providing Humanitarian Aid during emergencies and working for sustainable development of the world's poorest people. In Pakistan, Islamic Relief doing its operations since 1992 and is currently working through its offices in Azad Jammu & Kashmir, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Balochistan, Sindh & Punjab provinces.

Islamic Relief Pakistan (IRP) aims to protect children against violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect in all the context especially during emergencies. In the humanitarian context, IRP is guided by its core values, and Core Humanitarian Standards (CHS), policies of Child Protection, Safeguarding and Protection from Sexual, Exploitation, and Abuse & Harassment (PSEAH). Child marriage is a significant issue in Pakistan, with a high prevalence rate, particularly in rural areas and among marginalized communities.

According to UNICEF, Pakistan has one of the highest rates of child marriage in the world. Approximately 21% of girls in Pakistan are married before the age of 18, and 3% are married before the age of 15. Boys are also affected by child marriage, but to a lesser extent. Furthermore studies shows that Child marriage rates vary across regions in Pakistan. The practice is more prevalent in rural areas compared to urban areas, and rates tend to be higher in provinces such as Sindh and Balochistan. In close coordination and collaboration with the government, faith leaders and other stakeholders, IRP will respond to child marriage issues by implementing Channel of Hope (CoH) Strategy and methodology with Islamic faith perspective in the target areas.

Islamic Relief Pakistan proposes to raise awareness among communities to mitigate the negative effects of child marriages and its impact over wellbeing of the children in ten districts of four provinces, including AJK. Meaningful nexus of faith perspective and protection standards, together with strong consideration of Do No Harm will be the core of IRP proposed strategy to protect children to protect them from sexual, physical and mental exploitation. Leveraging on Islamic Relief established repute with local communities and faith leaders, the project will be implemented, considering the principles of Islamic shariah, IR Islamic declaration on child protection and role of faith leaders to tackle the challenges around child marriages in Pakistan. The project aims to achieve the goal "Children adolescents, are better protected from child marriage".

More specifically, the project results:

Output 1: Establish/strengthening interfaith National/provincial forums to prevent Child Marriage Output 2: Community engagement on the prevention of child marriage

Objectives:

1. Baseline Assessment and Understanding of the Current Situation:

- To gain a clear understanding of the current situation and conditions regarding child marriage, including current statistics and cultural context across the four provinces in the project intervention areas.
- To provide a comprehensive understanding of the baseline context to inform the design, planning, and implementation of project activities.
- To contribute to evidence-based decision-making and learning throughout the project lifecycle by conducting baseline assessments and understanding the current situation.

2. Baseline Data Collection and Monitoring Framework:

- To collect baseline data on relevant indicators, variables, and factors related to child marriage that will serve as benchmarks for assessing the project's progress and impact over time.
- To facilitate the monitoring and evaluation of the project by providing a reference point for comparison with data collected during and after project implementation.
- To establish a foundation for measuring the effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability of the project interventions over the course of its implementation through baseline data collection and monitoring.

3. Stakeholder Engagement and Partnership Building:

- To identify existing challenges, gaps, and needs within the target communities or populations that the project aims to address.
- To determine the baseline levels of knowledge, attitudes, behaviors, or other relevant factors related to the project's objectives.
- To engage stakeholders and build partnerships by sharing baseline findings and soliciting input for project planning and implementation.
- To ensure transparency and accountability by documenting the starting point of the project and its intended impact areas, thereby fostering stakeholder engagement and building partnerships.

These three broad objectives encompass the goals of gaining a comprehensive understanding of the current situation, establishing baseline data collection and monitoring frameworks, and engaging stakeholders for effective project planning and implementation.

"In addition to the baseline data collection activities outlined in the TORs, a mapping activity will be conducted to identify existing resources, services, and stakeholders related to child marriage prevention within the project area. This mapping activity will involve:

- 1. Identifying key stakeholders, including local government agencies, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), community leaders, religious leaders, healthcare providers, educators, and other relevant entities.
- 2. Mapping existing services and interventions aimed at preventing child marriage, such as educational programs, health services, legal support, and community outreach initiatives.
- 3. Assessing the coverage and accessibility of these services within the target communities.
- 4. Analyzing gaps and overlaps in services and identifying areas for collaboration and coordination among stakeholders.

5. Documenting best practices and lessons learned from existing interventions for informing the design and implementation of the project's activities.

The findings from this mapping activity will complement the baseline data collected and provide valuable insights into the existing landscape of child marriage prevention efforts in the project area. This information will help tailor our interventions effectively and leverage existing resources and partnerships to achieve project objectives."

2. Study Methodology:

The baseline is intended for project team, community people and stakeholders (government, non-government, etc.) as well as children and their families to understand the current situation and gaps for improving the lives of children and their families.

Detail of Responsibilities of IRP and the Consultant

Responsibilities of Consultant/Firm

3. Main Deliverables

• Inception Report

The inception report will clearly articulate agreed scope and plans for the survey, refining plans following induction. It will include the proposed methodologies, data collection and reporting plans with draft data collection tools as per methodology, clearly enunciated roles and responsibilities within the team, a timeframe with clear dates for deliverables, and the travel and

logistical arrangements' plan for the team. After review and approval by the IRP of data collection tools, methodology, and timeframe, the inception report will be finalized, and then data collection will commence.

Data of Baseline (Ownership)

The data collected through different tools of the baseline study will be the exclusive ownership of Islamic Relief and it shall not be otherwise referred until the formal consent of IR is sought. The Data will be shared/delivered to IR once the data collection exercise gets concluded. The data is expected to qualify the fundamental credentials to be primary, valid, accurate and reliable. The data can be provided both in hard/soft form to IR.

1st Draft Report and Presentation

The preliminary report will be submitted to the management of IR, who will assess the quality of the report providing inputs/feedback where pertinent. 1st draft report is expected to cover all the key requirements as per TORs. The draft report template shall be the part of Inception Report.

Final Draft

Final draft is to be submitted within three days of feedback received from IR. The final draft shall also include as incumbent component," the Plan for Scalability and Expansion". This may also cover the plan entailing the opportunities for strategic partnerships for long term rehabilitation, recovery and reconstruction.

4. Ethical considerations
